THE BOROUGH OF WELWYN HATFIELD (VARIOUS ROADS, HOLLYBUSH, WELWYN GARDEN CITY) (RESTRICTION OF WAITING AND PERMIT PARKING ZONES) ORDER 202X

Welwyn Hatfield Borough Council is proposing to introduce resident permit parking zones and waiting restrictions in Various Roads, Hollybush, Welwyn Garden City

Residents in the roads listed were consulted on proposed restrictions to address existing problems. Residents expressed concerns about local businesses causing congestion and vehicles being parked too close to junctions.

The proposed restrictions are as follows:

Double yellow lines (No waiting at any time), affecting parts of

Burrowfield, Chequers, Cole Green Lane, East Burrowfield, Four Acres, Gooseacre, Great Ley, Hitherbaulk, Hollybush Lane, Homestead Lane, Hunters Way, Hyde Valley, Leigh Common, Little Burrowfield, Little Ley, Meadway, Oaken Grove, Raymonds Close, Raymonds Plain, Sir John Newsom Way, Southfield, Twelve Aches, Two Acres, West Burrowfield, Woodhall Lane

Permit Parking, Monday – Friday, 9am – 5pm, permit holders only for Zone A19, affecting parts of

• Chequers

Having considered the duty imposed by Section 122 Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, Welwyn Hatfield Borough Council consider that it is necessary and expedient to make Orders for the following reasons:-

- For the purposes of relieving or preventing congestion of traffic.
